

Science*

- Forces—Explore Gravitational force and how unsupported objects fall towards the Earth because of the force of gravity acting between the Earth and the falling object.



Science*

- describe the movement of system

- describe the sun, Earth and moon as approximately spherical bodies

- use the idea of the Earth's rotation to explain day and night and the apparent movement of the sun across the sky



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
WOW Moment:

Geography: Place Knowledge
understand geographical similarities and differences through the study of human and physical geography of: a region within North America



Geography: Human and Physical

- describe and understand key aspects of: physical geography, including: mountains, volcanoes and earthquakes
- describe and understand key aspects of: human geography, including: types of settlement (linked to making settlements safe)



Geography: Skills and Fieldwork

- use maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate countries and describe features studied: use the eight points of a compass, four and six-figure grid references, symbols and key (including the use of Ordnance Survey maps) to build their knowledge of the United Kingdom and the wider world
- use maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate countries and describe features studied: use the eight points of a compass, four and six-figure grid references, symbols and key (including the use of Ordnance Survey maps) to build their knowledge of the United Kingdom and the wider world

Geography: Locational Knowledge

- locate the world's countries, using maps to focus on Europe (including the location of Russia) and **North America**, concentrating on their environmental regions, key physical and human characteristics, countries, and major cities
- identify the position and significance of latitude, longitude, Equator, Northern Hemisphere, Southern Hemisphere, the Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn, Arctic and Antarctic Circle, the Prime/Greenwich Meridian and time zones (including day and night)

Science: Biology


Explore and describe the life process of reproduction in some plants and animals.
